## **GM Social Enterprise Survey Headlines**

There are more than 3,500 social enterprises in Greater Manchester investing between £45-90m back into the region every year.

More than two thirds of social enterprises work directly in a neighbourhood or locality.

41% of social enterprises in Greater Manchester are reinvesting profits in the communities in which they operate.

49% of Greater Manchester social enterprises work in education, health & social care.

One fifth of social enterprises in GM work to improve people's health and wellbeing, another fifth work directly to support vulnerable people

94% have at least one woman on their board, 18% have board members that are black or minority ethnic, 33% have disabled people on their board.

63% of social enterprises have members of the local community on their board.

Less than 10% of social enterprises in Greater Manchester are charities, much lower than the national average of 20%.

86% of social enterprises in GM pay the real Living Wage (rather than the National Living Wage). This is far higher than the rest of the private sector and even higher than other social enterprises in the rest of the UK.
